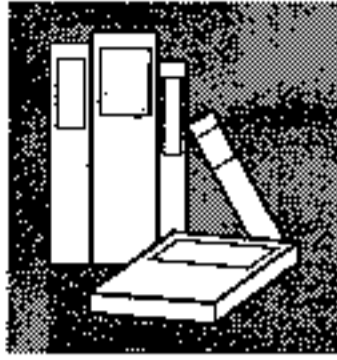

ALL is a peer-led, membership-driven cooperative, which embraces learning as a lifelong process.
