July 9 – **Geocaching: a 21st Century Treasure Hunt!**First Congregational Church, 4515 SW West Hills Road Kris Egan, geocacher, will introduce participants and facilitate their learning how to use a GPS receiver to find a hidden cache in an activity called Geocaching. A limited number of loaner GPS receivers will be available, or participants can bring their own. The receiver must be able to show latitude & longitude, so not all car navigation models will work. Check your owner's manual. Class will be outside part of the time, so dress for the weather! Why not plan a grandparent/grandchild experience. Your teenage grandchildren are welcome to join ALL for this class.

July 16 – **Dreaming Outdoors: The Challenges of Mounting Shakespeare in the Open Air**Scott Palmer, Artistic Director of Bag & Baggage Productions and Director of OSU's 2008 Production of *A Midsummer Night's Dream* will address the challenges of mounting and producing outdoor theatre, the implications of working outdoors on actors and theatre technicians. He will examine the adaptation of Shakespeare's *A Midsummer Night's Dream* that will be performed for the 2008 Bard in the Quad outdoor Summer Shakespeare performance. Maggie Chapin and Johanne Scoular, two of the cast members of the show, will also participate in the presentation.

Meet on the steps of the Memorial Union on the OSU campus. The class will be held outside, and you may wish to bring a lawn chair or other seating for your comfort. Please also be aware that the weather may be warm, so bring your hat, plenty of water and sunscreen.

July 23 – Taras Liskevych– *All That Glitters is Not Gold* – **How to Watch the Beijing Olympics.** First Congregational Church, 4515 SW West Hills Road

The Opening Ceremony of the 2008 Beijing Olympics is on August 8th. A look at the Olympics from several perspectives -- athlete's, coach's, administrator's, media, fans, etc. Learn more about the history of Olympics, the Olympic experience and what to look for in Beijing. Taras "Terry" Liskevych, OSU Women's Volleyball Coach and former US Olympic Women's Volleyball Head Coach (1988, 1992 & 1996) will help us be better observers of this summer's Olympics.

July 30 – 1:30 PM – 3:30 PM Oh, Rapture! Gilbert and Sullivan at OSU

OSU Theatre Lobby – Withycombe Hall
Charlotte Headrick, OSU Professor of Theatre Arts and play director, will talk about this summer (2008) production of Gilbert and Sullivan's *The Mikado*, which will be the 99th anniversary of Gilbert and Sullivan at Oregon State University. In 1909, *The Mikado* was presented here on campus. Just as there was a lull before the University Theatre started producing Shakespeare outdoors (it was done on campus outdoors in the 1920s), OSU had not produced Gilbert and Sullivan on a regular basis until the late 1980s. She will be sharing some of that history and particularly what has been done with *The Mikado* in previous productions and what is being done with it this summer.

August 6 – **Cemeteries**Crystal Lake Cemetery

Judy Juntunen, local historian, will lead a tour through Crystal Lake Cemetery, one of the oldest in Benton County — an open air museum full of local history and art. The tour will give you an opportunity to find out why it was established in this location, learn about some of the people who are buried here, hear about the Civil War veterans' project, and look at the diverse markers and the cemetery's statuary.

Located on SE Crystal Lake Drive. Proceed to SE 3rd St. and Crystal Lake Drive; turn east on Crystal Lake Drive and continue until you come to the south end of the cemetery where the entrance is located. The cemetery shares a driveway with COHO Eco Village. Please do not park in their lot. Parking will be along the edge of the road in the cemetery. Meet at the Civil War Soldier's Statue to begin the tour. Wear comfortable walking shoes.

August 13-- **Tour of OSU** OSU - Benton Hall

Larry Landis, Oregon State University Archivist, will lead a tour of the OSU Campus to talk about several of OSU's historic buildings of the core campus area and the architects that designed them. The tour begins on the east side of Benton Hall and concludes in the library quad on the north side of Kidder Hall. Wear walking shoes.
