WHAT IS ALL?

The Academy for Lifelong Learning (ALL), established in 2002, is a self-funded, peer-led membership organization. ALL embraces learning as a lifelong process. As such, members —now numbering more than 300— support the Academy’s objectives through their participation as students, as presenters, and generally in the successful operation of the program. The classes offered during the summer are intended to take advantage of the season and access to venues. The Fall 2010 Schedule of Classes will be available in August on the website and in the mail, if you are on the ALL mailing list. So attend a summer class and then join ALL for the Fall. A year’s membership is \$100. You may attend as many classes as you wish for a full year beginning the term in which you join. (Additional fees are charged for a few classes to cover books, travel, class materials, meals, etc.). If you attended just two out of every three classes offered, each class would cost less than \$1 to attend — **What A Deal!!**

July 7 – **Hiking and Learning About McDonald Forest** (and optional lunch) Peavy Arboretum Lodge



Chris Jackson, OSU Forest Recreation Manager, will lead us on a hike and discuss the Intensive Management and Calloway Creek trails in Peavy Arboretum. The hike will have a shorter version for those who can not walk for the entire time. Wear walking shoes and bring a hat and water. Meet and park at **Peavy Arboretum Lodge** on Arboretum Road (left onto OR 99W from Walnut, go 3.7 mi., turn left at NW Arboretum Rd., go .8 mi., and then turn left at NW Peavy Arboretum Rd). After the hike, Chris Jackson will be joining in a picnic lunch with those who wish to stay, eat, visit, and ask any questions. Box lunches will be available to purchase at the beginning of the class. You may also bring your own lunch.

July 14 – **9:30 AM Historic Hull-Oakes Steam Powered Saw Mill Tour** First Congregational Church*

The Hull Oakes Mill is the last steam powered sawmill in the U. S. that runs on a commercial basis. It is able to process large logs up to 85 feet long. Participants must be able to walk on uneven ground, climb stairs, and walk for several blocks in distance. Meet at the church parking lot at **8:30 AM** to car pool to the mill. The mill is located about 15 miles south of Corvallis near Monroe.



July 21 – **Studio & Art Collection Tour** Johnson Home

Susan Johnson, local artist and former director of the Corvallis Art Center, and Curtis Johnson, retired OSU biophysics professor and woodworker, will lead a tour of the art and woodworking studios in their house. Art has been the focus of their lives, and their home reveals this focus and passion. Susan will show the seven workstations that lead an artwork from creation to shows and sales. Curtis will lead visitors through their home to view their personal art collection, and he will tell stories about various pieces, including the furniture he designed and built. This class meets at their home, **1265 NW Heather** (west on Oak Creek Dr, turn left at NW Ridgewood Dr .4 mi., take the 3rd right onto NW Fuchsia and then the second right on to Heather with the dead end sign. Ignore all other Heather signs. Their home is the third house on the right as you go down the hill.)

July 28 – **“Double, Double, Toil, and Dirty, Sexy, Fun”** OSU - Withycombe Hall

Elizabeth Helman, OSU Department of Theatre Arts and Director of this year’s Bard on the Quad production, will outline the conceptual and background information about this summer’s Bard in the Quad production of Macbeth. Set in prohibition-era New Orleans, this production will explore Shakespeare’s themes of ambition and power amidst a backdrop of a violent underground crime syndicate. August 4 – **Beyond Goodnight Moon and Harry Potter** Corvallis Public Library



Join Corvallis-Benton County Public Library, Youth Services librarians Curtis Kiefer and Kristin Starnes, as they guide you on a journey of discovery with exciting new books for children and teens. You will learn what makes for a good book for children of all ages, whether they are newborn, learning to read, can't get enough to read, or never pick up a book. Discover books *you* will enjoy reading, too. Booklists and handouts will be provided. This class will meet in the **Corvallis-Benton County Public Library Meeting Room - 645 NW Monroe Avenue.**

August 11 – **Gathering Together Farm Tour** (and optional lunch) First Congregational Church*

Tour the Gathering Together Certified Organic Farm. At the farm, we will ride on top of a flat bed truck, and the ride can be very bumpy. Be prepared to walk up steps to get into the truck. We will meet at the Church at **9:30 AM** to car pool to the Farm. Optional lunch at 11:30 AM will be a three-course meal (green salad, chicken roulade or vegetarian option, dessert) meal costing \$15 including tip. Please check box if you want lunch, so we can let the farm restaurant know how many lunches to prepare.

* Car pooling from the First Congregational Church to the tour site reduces parking at tour site, BUT you must plan on earlier meeting time to allow for driving time and later return time after tour [and optional lunch when offered].
