


Class Times, Locations, & Days Vary: Please Plan Accordingly


18 July [10:00 AM] Chintimini Wildlife Center Tour and Bird of Prey Demonstration 311 NW Lewisburg Ave., Corvallis

25 July [10:00 AM] Tour of National Clonal Germplasm Repository 33447 Peoria Road, Corvallis



Did a blight kill your hazelnuts, or zap your blueberries? Never fear, the National Clonal Germplasm Repository [NCGR] can save you. One of 30 in the U.S., this USDA facility collects, preserves, and distributes germplasm of important economic crops to people throughout the world. Each repository is responsible for certain species—for the Corvallis facility: pears, hazelnuts, blueberries, hops, strawberries, and others. Kim Hummer, Ph.D., will give a tour of the labs, greenhouses, and fields at NCGR. Located on Peoria Road, about 1 mile from the Highway 34 junction. The Repository is handicapped accessible.


This year's Bard in the Quad will feature a dark and magical adaptation of *The Tempest* featuring original music and designs inspired by the art nouveau styles of Alphonse Mucha and Aubrey Beardsley and the films of Tim Burton and Baz Lurhman. Nature comes to life on Prospero and Miranda's mysterious island and this lecture, by the director Dr. Elizabeth Helman, will feature analysis of what is considered Shakespeare's last solo-written play and draw parallels between the creator and his creation. 2 August [2:00 PM] Tour of Historic Bush House Museum

600 Mission Street SE, Salem

Salem has many interesting attractions and one of the best is the 1878 Bush House Museum which is a well preserved relic of the era with most of its original furnishings. The Bush House is typical of the English style adapted by prosperous American merchants and professionals of post-Civil War years. Tours of the two-story structure point out the 10 fireplaces, the original gas-powered chandeliers, a piano shipped around Cape Horn in 1863 and a 200-year-old grandfather clock. The tour will last about 1 hour. [Registration on ALL website required!—24 Max] Pickup and pay (~\$5) for your tour ticket at the Bush Barn Art Gallery which is about 250 feet from the museum. The tour starts at 2 PM. The formal address is 600 Mission Street SE, but the simplest entry is on High St. SE at Bush St. For more information see the Bush House Museum website:
